

Analysis of the questionnaires

Evaluation of the questionnaire for adults:

1 How important do you consider to deal with children's rights?

According to the questionnaires, 95% of the participants consider it important to refresh the topic now and again, the remaining 5% think that children's rights have to be respected all the time during their work, so it is not necessary to call the adults' attention to it. Children when getting into residential care are informed about their rights.

2 Did the training give you new information?

100% of the respondents think that during the training they learnt new opportunities they can make the understand of children's rights for children easier with.

22% of the respondents also noted that the training put some problems into a new light.

3 Are children's rights respected during your work?

100% of the respondents answered that children's rights are respected in every situation.

4 What are the children's rights, the respect of which means problem in the everyday life?

35% of the respondents think that there is no problem with the respect of children's rights. 65% of the respondents said that material and factual conditions of the institute ensure the children's rights but rights to the housing, meals, clothing and culture can be complained qualitatively.

5 What difficulties are there (if any)?

92% of the respondents mention the right to learning, going to school and keeping contact with parents and relatives, which is often violated. Children's rights to going to school and learning are violated because children don't fulfill their obligations, while keeping contact is violated because of the failure of the parents, because the opportunity is ensured in every case.

6 How did you feel during the training?

100% of the participants felt well, found the training useful and think that they also had the opportunity to discuss their problems.

7 Would you like to participate in a similar programme?

91% gave positive answer to the question, for the remaining 9% it made difficulties to take part in the training in their free time.

By the evaluation of the questionnaires and the feedback got at the end of the training we can state that the training for adults has reached its aims. Adults working in the residential homes know the children's rights and they try to respect them in the everyday life. By the feedback we can say that the training has widened the participants' knowledge with new methods and ideas, which they find very useful. The training gave them opportunity to exchange their experience and learn each other's difficulties. They stated it is difficult for them in the everyday life to harmonize the rights and obligations in the childrens' acts and to learn how not to violate the rights of others living around them while proving their own rights.

Evaluation of the questionnaire for children:

1 Did you previously get any information about that also children have rights?

98% of the asked children had already had information about children's rights. 2% of the asked children gave „no” answer. It was because they got into the residential home those days.

2 Are your children's rights respected in the everyday life?

98% think that their rights are respected. Those who didn't know the children's rights could not decide how much they are respected.

3 Which rights of yours do you think are the most violated?

74% of the respondents feel that their rights are not violated. 10% of the respondents feel that they are barred in the relation with their families. 11% of the respondents feel that they are barred in the relation with their friends. 8% of the respondents feel that their rights to amusement are violated

4 Do you consider the training dealing with children's rights to be useful?

100% of the respondents answered „yes”

5 Did you get new information during the training, if yes, what was it?

89% of the respondents think they did and it regards mainly the special rights coming from taking into care. For the 2% who didn't have any information previously, every information was new. 9% of the respondents felt that they had had all the information.

6 How did you feel during the training?

100% of the respondents felt well during the training.

7 Would you like to participate in similar training?

89% of the respondents answered „yes”. 6% answered yes, if it won't be boring. 5% said yes if the training will deal with their special problems.

By the evaluation of the questionnaires and the feedback got at the end of the training we can state that the training for children was effective and successful. After taking into care most of the children get information about their rights and they get the necessary help to comply their rights. Independently of having the right information or not it is important that these knowledges come to the front now and again. The structure of the training provided a good opportunity to free discussions, building relations and gave sample to the useful spending of free time.
